EARLY INTERVENTION SUPPORT CLASS (EI)

General Information

The Early Intervention program operates during school terms and provides a preschool/school readiness program. Children with a disability from 3 years of age to school entry are eligible to apply.

Early Intervention Support Class sessions provide individualised learning programs in a class of up to eight. The program runs for 2.5 hrs five days a week and each child is eligible to attend two sessions a week. The program operates on the South Grafton Public School infants campus.

The sessions are run with a full time Early Intervention teacher and a school learning and support officer. The Early Intervention teacher will be involved with the ongoing collaborative support for each child enrolled in the sessions.

The staff will work closely with the families of the children and other early childhood service providers to identify and develop the skills that each child needs to be meaningfully included as well as build on each child's strengths and interests.

Early Intervention Support Class

Early Intervention is specialised support provided for young children who have a disability or learning support need and their families. It promotes each child's development and meaningful participation in all aspects of their life.

Early Intervention helps support the children and their families with the transition into kindergarten at their zoned school.
