WHAT ARE THE CHANGES?

Our program has a new name - rebel Community Givebacks.

HAS THE STRUCTURE OF THE PROGRAM CHANGED?

No – there are no changes to how an approved sports club or school earns credits.

HAS ANYTHING CHANGED WHEN USING CREDITS?

Yes - credits can be used to purchase relevant sporting goods and equipment for your club or school. Credits can no longer be used to purchase gift cards.
